The nurse calls the surgeon to report that a male client who was transitioned from a patient controlled analgesic (PCA) pump to a PO analgesic one hour ago, is now complaining in a loud voice and asking for the PCA pump. The nurse explains that the client's behavior is disturbing his roommate. The client's blood pressure has increased from 120/72 mmHg to 150/98 mmHg. Which question is **best** to include in the recommendation component of the SBAR report to the surgeon?

- A Could the client's behavior be a manifestation of drug seeking behaviors?
- B Can the client be transferred to a private room?
- C Can the PCA pump be initiated and prescribed for an additional 12 hours?
- D Why has the client become so agitated?



The nurse is assigned to care for four clients. After receiving the change of shift report, which client should the nurse assess **first**?

- A A client with diabetes and a history of coronary artery disease who is complaining of increased shortness of breath.
- B A 10-year-old with sickle-cell disease who has a morphine PCA pump, but is complaining of pain at 2 to 3 on a 10 point scale.
- C A 29-year-old who has had chronic kidney disease (CKD) for the past year and had an AV fistula placed yesterday.
- D An older client with COPD who is experiencing shortness of breath and whose O₂ saturation rate is 88% on room air.

A healthcare provider notifies the nurse that new prescriptions have been written for a client. Which is the **first** action the nurse should implement?

- A Collect any needed forms such as laboratory and radiology requisitions.
- B Clarify the prescriptions with the unit clerk to ensure accurate transcription.
- C Document the time that the provider visited the client in the nurses' notes.
- D Read all of the new prescriptions for the client written by the provider.
