Use the following scenario to answer questions 13 through 15: You or at one of your clinical placements with a school nurse. A Parent walks into the office and asked to speak to the nurse the school nurse introduces you to the parent and offers your assistance. The parent says "my son is John Smith. He is eight years old and a student in Mr. Albright's class. The doctor put him on methylphenidate. I'm not sure how I feel about this. He has been on it for 10 days now. I have some questions I'd like to ask you. Jon weighs 62 pounds. My friend's son went on methylphenidate and lost weight. Do you think that's what happened to John?"

What response by the nurse would be the most appropriate?

**A: "giving Jon his first dose of methylphenidate after breakfast and a second dose in the early afternoon is the most effective strategy for preventing weight loss."**

B: "continue to give John his methylphenidate, but if you noticed weight loss, you should abruptly discontinue this medication."
