1. **costs of not serving alcohol responsibly:** -human costs

4. **criminal liability results in:** -jail time

-probation

-fines

5. **civil liability:** if you break alcohol laws and someone gets hurt, you can be sued or forced to pay the damages

6. **dram shop laws:** special kind of civil liability for people who serve alcohol

-allow a person who was not at a business to sue for injuries caused by a guest who was drinking there

-EX: person drives home from your establishment drunk and kills someone. the bartender, owner, and manager can be sued for the death

7. **Administrative liability:** deals with penalties for establishments and employees who do not follow alcohol laws

-penalties given by liquor authorities

8. **liquor authorities job:** -grant liquor licenses

-help enforce state and local liquor laws

-can penalize establishments and employees who break laws

9. **penalties from liquor authorities:** -suspensions or loss of liquor license

-loss of a servers right to serve alcohol

-fines against owner and staff

10. **minimum age to buy, possess, and drink alcohol:** 21
