ANS: limit visitors to healthy adults

3. a nurse is caring for a client who has an intestinal obstruction and reports a new onset of nausea. the client has an NG tube set at low intermittent suction and is receiving continuous IV infusion of 0.9% sodium chloride. Which of the following actions should the nurse take first

ANS: check for kinks in the NG tube

4. a nurse in a clinic is assisting with the development of a pamphlet about STIs. which of the following information should the nurse recommend to include in the pamphlet?

ANS: women have a higher risk of contracting STIs than men

5. a nurse is reinforcing teaching with a client who is postoperative following a cemented total hip arthroplasty. Which of the following instructions should the nurse include?

ANS: maintain hip flexion to 90 degrees or less when sitting
